Grace & Truth The Defeat of Death and Victory Through the Resurrection 1 Corinthians 15:35-58

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

Who is your favorite athlete? What draws you to this particular athlete?

QUICK REVIEW

Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time, caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

MAIN POINTS:

The hope of the resurrection fills us with courage to face life and death, and gives direction and urgency to how we live here and now.

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. **Read 1 Corinthians 15:35 aloud.** Paul presents this as a rhetorical question, possibly one he had heard or in response to doubts expressed by the Corinthians. What do you believe is at the heart of the question?
 - a. How does Paul respond to the question, "How are the dead raised?." What illustration does he use in his answer? Read John 12:24 aloud and compare what Jesus says to Paul's response.
 - b. What does Paul anticipate the argument against the resurrection to be?
 - c. In your own words, answer the question, "With what kind of body do they come?". **Read 1 Corinthians 15:42-44** to help you in your answer.

- 2. **Read 1 Corinthians 15:36-48 aloud**. In these verses, Paul refutes the objections posed in verse 35. He begins with a rebuke in verse 36. What is the point he is making in this verse? How does this respond to his question in verse 35?
 - a. In verses 37-41, Paul continues making his point. If asked, how would you summarize what Paul is saying in these verses?
 - b. In verses 42-49, Paul continues to explain the difference between the fleshly body and the spiritual body.
 - i. What two people does Paul use in his illustration?
 - ii. There are five observations Paul makes about Adam that he uses to draw conclusions about Jesus. Discuss these five observations and conclusions.
- 3. **Read 1 Corinthians 15:50-55 aloud**. Summarize what Paul is saying in these verses.
 - a. Paul seems to be addressing a concern expressed by the Corinthians about those who are alive when Christ returns. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 aloud and compare this to 1 Corinthians 15:51. How do these verses correlate to your beliefs?
 - b. How would you explain these verses to someone hearing them for the first time?
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 15:56-58 aloud. Discuss the following:
 - a. Verse 56 says that "the power of sin is the law", what does he mean?
 - b. Read Romans 6:23 aloud and discuss how it relates to verses 56-57.
 - c. How should we apply what Paul says in verse 58? What is "the work of the Lord" that Paul speaks of?
